# **Hattiesburg Native Graduates Top of Class** in U.S. Army Basic Training

HATTIESBURG, Miss.—— Pvt. Odell Scott Jr. completed Army Basic Training with a near-perfect score.

Officials said the rare accomplishment is a sign of the Hattiesburg native's dedication.

Before enlisting in the Army, Scott faced many challenges, including dropping out of high school.

Scott still found his way by pursuing welding through Job Corps. He also earned his high school diploma.

At the end of Job Corps, Scott met Sgt. 1st Class Harvey McCuiston, an Army recruiter. McCuiston told Scott that the Army would be a perfect fit for the young man.

"My expectation of him was not for him to be the top undergrad, but to join the Army and better himself," McCuiston said. "Through it all, he persevered and he ended up being the distinguished undergrad at basic training, which is a testimony of what he believed in and his faith in God and his family"

As a Distinguished Honor Graduate, Scott said this accomplishment makes him optimistic about his future.


alongside recruiters... to really show how the Army is invested in America's future."


